Resolved, the appeal of the order by the District Court in relation to New Vision and Frank McDowell be filed and Assistant City Attorney Von Holtum is authorized and instructed to file the said appeal.

PREVIOUS CONTRACT WITH ARCHITECT RESCINDED - MAYOR AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE REVISED CONTRACT WITH BKV GROUP, INC AND TO EXECUTE CONSTRUCTION MANAGER CONTRACT WITH RJM CONSTRUCTION

The motion was made by Alderman Ten Haken, seconded by Alderman Woll and unanimously carried that the October 27, 2008 acceptance of the previous architect contract be rescinded and the Mayor be authorized to execute the revised contract with BKV Group, Inc. and to execute the construction manager contract with JRM Construction with the elimination of the arbitration provisions 1.3.5 and Article 8 respectively in each document, and upon the condition of receipt of a memorandum of understanding regarding change orders and drawings.

2009 SCHEDULED POLICE VEHICLE REPLACEMENTS CONFIRMED

The motion was made by Alderman Woll, seconded by Alderman Wood and unanimously carried to confirm the equipment purchase replacement of Animal Control Truck - 1999 Ford F-150, Detective Car - 2001 Chevrolet Malibu, Detective Car - 2001 Chevrolet Malibu, Patrol Car - 1999 Ford Crown Victoria, and the Patrol car - 2005 Ford Crown Victoria, according to the budgeted Police Department's 2009 vehicle replacement schedule and authorize the Patrol K-9 squad purchase with savings generated from vehicle purchases.

CONSIDERATION OF REQUEST TO PURCHASE TRUCK UNIT

Council considered a request from staff to purchase a new 2010 truck to replace two truck units currently in use by the Public Works Department. The unit is included in the 2009 budget. After discussion, Council determined to not take action on this item at this time but to consider it again once the 2009 Local Government Aid cuts are known.

REVISED BIKEWAY CONCEPT PRESENTED

Council heard information on the revised off street bikeway system design that has been altered due to safety concerns along C.S.A.H. 10. No action was requested.

FIRST READING PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE XV OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON - GARAGE SALES/SWIMMING POOLS

The motion was made by Alderman Kuhle, seconded by Alderman Ten Haken and unanimously carried to give a first reading of a proposed ordinance amending Title XV of the City Code of the City of Worthington, Accessory Uses as follows:

Section I.

That Worthington City Code, Title XV, Section 155.059 shall be amended to read as follows:

155.059 ACCESSORY USES.

Except as otherwise provided below, accessory uses shall be permitted in each district where they are incidental to the uses therein.

- (A) Accessory uses in residential districts shall be permitted according to the terms of §§ 155.075, and according to the terms of division (B) below of this section.
- (B) The following accessory uses shall not be allowed unless they comply with the following conditions and requirements.

- (1) Private swimming pools. Private nonportable swimming pools may not be located closer than ten feet to any property line and shall be walled or fenced to a height of six four feet to prevent uncontrolled access by children from the street or from adjoining properties. A swimming pool shall be defined as any structure intended for swimming, recreational bathing or wading which contains or which is designed to contain water over 24 inches deep. This includes in-ground, above-ground and on-ground pools; indoor pools; hot tubs or spas without operable and securable safety covers; and fixed-in-place wading pools.
- (2) *Temporary uses*. Buildings, construction trailer, equipment and materials used in conjunction with construction work shall be removed upon completion of said construction work and issuance of a certificate of occupancy.
- (3) Amateur radio towers. Amateur radio towers shall comply with the same setback requirements of the principal structure in the district it is located in and not exceed a height of 50 feet.
- (4) Garage Sales. Garage sales may be held on residential property by the owner or resident of that property for no more than three consecutive days, on four separate occasions per calendar year.

FIRST READING PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE XV OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON - CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS

The motion was made by Alderman Kuhle, seconded by Alderman Ten Haken and unanimously carried to give a first reading to a proposed ordinance amending Title XV of the City Code of the City of Worthington, Construction of Improvements, as follows:

Section I.

That Worthington City Code, Title XV, Section 154.36 shall be amended to read as follows:

154.36 CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS.

(A) Before any final plat or minor subdivision is approved by the City Council or recorded, the subdivider shall make and install the applicable improvements listed in division (E) of this section. In lieu of completion prior to final approval, the city shall require a contract secured by a cash deposit, certified check, or bond in an amount and with surety and conditions satisfactory to it, to assure the city that such improvements will actually be constructed and installed according to the approved specifications within one year of final approval. No building permits will be issued for construction within the subdivision prior to the construction of the improvements in divisions (E)(1) through (5) below.

A final plat or minor subdivision shall be exempt from the requirements of division (A) if the improvements are otherwise financed pursuant to the terms of the Workforce Housing Program, which was adopted by the City Council on November 10, 2008.

PURCHASE OF REAL ESTATE SIGNS APPROVED

The motion was made by Alderman Ten Haken, seconded by Alderman Wood and unanimously carried to purchase two 8 x 16 foot signs and four 4 x 8 foot signs to promote the availability of City owned property for sale, utilizing WRH Impact Funds to hire Harvey Signs to construct the signs at an amount not to exceed \$3,000, and to work up a design concept for an additional 8 x 16 foot sign for the green park.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mayor Oberloh - nothing to report.

Alderman Ten Haken - attended an SRDC meeting last week, and reminded Council there is an SRDC orientation workshop on January 24th. Noted that Dave Benson is the new District 7 representative to the Area Transportation Partnership. Also, we need to start preparing now for the upcoming 2010 census to ensure accuracy.

Alderman Kuhle - attended a Convention and Visitors Bureau meeting, the CVB paid for a "rolling billboard" advertising the city of Worthington on a semi-trailer belonging to Smith Trucking.

Alderman Nelson - Thanked Mayor Oberloh for his appointment to the Traffic and Safety Board. Alderman Wood - Regarding the YMCA construction - there are holes dug and the pre-cast should be coming somewhere between February 9th to February 16th, and can expect to be able to work inside a portion of the building by mid March. Things are moving forward on the testing and training facility.

Alderman Woll - will be attending a Memorial Auditorium Advisory Board meeting next Thursday; did attend a Senior Center meeting - that committee will be coming to Council for guidance and will submit their budget at the next Council meeting.
