### WORTHINGTON CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING, SEPTEMBER 9, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall Council Chambers by Mayor Alan E. Oberloh with the following Council Members present: Mike Kuhle, Diane Graber, Rod Sankey, Ron Wood, Scott Nelson. Honorary Council Member: Robert Bristow.

Mayor Oberloh introduced Robert Bristow as the Honorary Council Person for July, August and September, 2013. Brad Chapulis, Director of Community/Economic Development, introduced Scott Gigrich, recently hired as the Code Enforcement Officer/Housing Inspector for the City of Worthington.

### COALITION OF GREATER MINNESOTA CITIES UPDATE

Elizabeth Wefel, Senior Attorney/Lobbyist for the Coalition of Greater Minnesota Cities (CGMC) was present and provided an update of their efforts on behalf of Worthington and other cities in Greater Minnesota over the last year, specifically during the last legislative session. Council thanked Ms. Wefel for her report.

### FIRE FIGHTER REQUEST FOR INCREASED PENSION CONTRIBUTION TABLED

Council considered a request from the Worthington Fire Department for an increase to their pension of .9% per year over a five year period, which would be an increase of \$2,452 over 20 years, or a more modest increase of .5% each year for five years, which would be \$1,362 over 20 years. Council had initially discussed the request at their Special Meeting August 23, 2013.

Following discussion, the motion was made by Council Member Kuhle and seconded by Council Member Nelson to increase the contribution to the pension plan by .9% for five years. Council Member Wood called for a friendly amendment to the motion to approve administration moving forward in bringing back a plan with a schedule of payments and how it's set up - what the accumulating cost will be in the fifth year. In response to a question from Council Member Wood, Mr. Shorter indicated that the requested .9% per year increase is for the past five years when they did not receive any increase - 4.5% as a one time increase - then come back each year for any future increases.

Following clarification, Council Members Kuhle and Nelson withdrew their motion and second.

Mayor Oberloh noted we need to see the numbers as we've already got a budget number for next year.

The motion was made by Council Member Wood, seconded by Council Member Nelson and unanimously carried that we support the request but that we need to have final numbers on the .9% retrospectively for five years to a total of 4.5%, and that we have a policy going forward for reviewing the contribution every one or two years.

# <u>WORTHINGTON REDISCOVERED APPLICATION APPROVED - SOUTHWEST MINNESOTA HOUSING PARTNERSHIP</u>

The Southwest Minnesota Housing Partnership had submitted an application for financial assistance to acquire and demolish the single family home at 2305 East Avenue. Acquisition of the property will provide additional space for proper storm water retention and provide more presence along County Road 5 for the HRA's Rising Sun Estates project. The Worthington Rediscovered Committee reviewed the application on September 6<sup>th</sup> and concluded the project is within the intent of the program, and that it should consider full participation as the end use would be the Worthington HRA, which is a public entity under the City's umbrella. The Committee was recommending awarding the Southwest Minnesota Housing Partnership funds for the actual costs incurred, not to exceed \$49,000, on the condition that the next real estate future transaction cannot be greater than \$1.

The motion was made by Council Member Graber, seconded by Council Member Wood and unanimously carried to approve an application from the Southwest Minnesota Housing Partnership (SMHP) for Worthington Rediscovered Funds for actual costs incurred for acquisition and demolition not to exceed \$49,000 on the condition that the next real estate transaction cannot be greater than \$1.

### **COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS**

<u>Mayor Oberloh</u> - nothing to report other than he will be attending an ATP meeting in Mankato. <u>Council Member Kuhle</u> - the Southwest Regional Development Commission will be meeting here at the fire hall on September 12, 2013. The full Board and Commission will be there - anyone interested should attend.

<u>Council Member Graber</u> - The Memorial Auditorium Advisory Board is still working on the signage and are going with Jasper Stone. The rigging grant was approved - a \$6,618 matching grant. The new tech employee has started. Attended a Southwest Minnesota Housing Partnership meeting with Craig and Brad. The building signage is in progress at the Center for Active Living - they also discussed group rates for use of the racket ball courts. The Heron Lake Watershed's budget was approved at \$250,000, the Jack Creek Sediment Project is still controversial - also discussed loans approved for septic systems - the request for a weed harvester was not approved. Open house at the CAL on September 19<sup>th</sup>.

Council Member Sankey - nothing to report.

Council Member Wood - nothing to report.

<u>Council Member Nelson</u> - HRA will meet tomorrow night - still difficulties with their 36 unit project and they will probably come back to Council for another look at their numbers.

### **CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

Craig Clark, City Administrator, noted appreciation to the Governor and our legislators for efforts on additional funding during the special session - they approved \$99,141 for the City of Worthington. We will continue to make our case moving forward in the next legislative session for our unmet needs.

The regular meeting of the Water and Light Commission was called to order in the Worthington Public Utilities Conference Room at 3:00 P.M., DST, by President Randy Thompson with the following members present: James Elsing, Ron Wood, Gary Hoffmann and Kevin Donovan.

#### WATER AND LIGHT COMMISSION MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Donovan, seconded by Commissioner Hoffmann and unanimously carried to approve the Water and Light Commission minutes of the regular meeting held August 19, 2013.

### WATER UPDATE

Scott Hain, General Manager, provided the Commission with an update on the well static levels at the Lake Bella well field. He also presented various graphs on the current well static levels compared to 10 and 15 year well static level trends. While reviewing the graphs, discussion was continued from previous meetings on establishing appropriate levels for imposing and lifting future bans on non-essential water use. Commission members were in agreement that utilizing the graph which illustrates the current static level of Well #26, above average static level area (area above the actual 15-year average) and below average static level area (area below the actual 15-year average but above 70% of the actual 15-year average) would be a good tool to use for determining when to impose and lift future bans on non-essential water use.

After discussion, a motion was made by Commissioner Donovan, seconded by Commissioner Wood and unanimously carried to authorize utility staff to impose a ban on non-essential water use should the current well static reading for Well #26 fall within the below average area on November 1 and to continue with the ban until the current well static level reaches an above average level. If the static level of Well #26 would fall below 70% of the actual 15-year average prior to November 1 a ban on non-essential water use would be imposed at that time.

### DISCUSSION ON MOVING MEETINGS TO A CONSENT AGENDA FORMAT

Discussion was held on moving future Water and Light Commission meetings to a consent agenda format to allow additional time for items requiring more extensive discussion and/or action. Items included for approval on the consent agenda would include the Water and Light Commission minutes, financial statements, staff reports, utility bills payable and other official business not requiring extensive discussion.

### 1. <u>CITY HALL CLOSURE - FRIDAY AFTER THANKSGIVING</u>

Since 2008 City Council has approved the closing of City offices on the Friday immediately following Thanksgiving. As the City of Worthington does not recognize the Friday after Thanksgiving as a legal holiday, employees are required to use PTO, their floating holiday, or unpaid time off for that day. They have also be given the option of working that day, however no public business shall be conducted. To date, staff is unaware of any negative comments due to the extended closing, as State offices and Nobles County offices are also closed on that Friday. Staff is requesting that Council once again approve the closing of City offices on the Friday after Thanksgiving.

# 1. <u>FIRST READING PROPOSED ORDINANCE PROVIDING CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR APPLICANTS FOR CITY LICENSES</u>

Effective Jan. 1, 2015, a City or County using a resolution as the basis for a local background check, or whose ordinance does not meet the minimum requirements established with the League, will receive a sanction as part of the audit process. This includes the requirement to stop running local checks until an acceptable ordinance is in place.

Minnesota Justice Information Services (MNJIS) is providing advance notice of this change to give Cities and Counties wishing to convert from a resolution to an ordinance, or needing to update an ordinance, ample time to do so. We are covered for the time being to conduct background checks, however, we need to adopt the ordinance shown as *Exhibit 1* to prevent being sanctioned after the January 2015 deadline.

On May 28, 2013 the Council approved a third reading of an ordinance providing for criminal history background checks for applicants for City employment. In consultation with

City Attorney Mark Shepherd it was determined that the City should have a separate ordinance to provide criminal history background checks for applicants for City licenses.

The City Clerk, Public Safety Director and City Attorney reviewed the City Code when drafting the ordinance to eliminate discrepancies and bring the ordinance into compliance with the State's requirements. The proposed ordinance was drafted and reviewed by City Attorney, Mark Shepherd.

Council action is requested to give a first reading to the proposed ordinance providing criminal history background checks on applicants for City licenses.

### 2. FIREFIGHTER RELIEF ASSOCIATION REQUEST FOR PENSION INCREASE

Staff met with the Fire Fighter Relief Association and discussed their request of 4.5 percent increase to their pension. They were receptive to a 2 percent increase effective January 1, 2014 (using the 2012 actuarial) rather than the previously requested 4.5 percent. This would take the pension benefit from \$2,725 to \$2,780 for a 20 year service amount from \$54,500 to \$55,590.

Having had the actuarial done in 2012 it would be required to do another one in mid-2014 and the Relief Association members would like Council to consider another increase later in 2014 that could be effective January 1, 2015.

At the last Council meeting there was interest in knowing the exact cost of the increase in benefit to the City but given the fact that the fund is dependent on the returns in the market it is not possible to provide a definitive number. Better returns mean less of a City contribution towards the retirement and vice versa. You may recall our contribution varies widely of what we are required to put in. Over the last five years it has ranged from \$0 to \$43,175 with an average of \$25,073 per year over that time period. However, using the past actuarial we can estimate the increased contribution for a 2 percent increase to be roughly \$3,075 for a total City pension contribution of \$84,891 minus the state fund of \$42,967.

Following this proposed time line would allow the firemen to address the fact that they have not come before Council for some time and align things to a two year cycle rotation to discuss the pension amount in conjunction with the required actuarial.

Council action is requested to approve the staff and Fire Fighter Relief Association request of a 2 percent increase in the pension amount to a benefit amount of \$2,780 per year per fireman effective January 1, 2014.

# AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 110, SECTION 110.02 PERTAINING TO APPLICATIONS FOR CITY LICENSES

The City Council of the City of Worthington Do Ordain:

Section I.

The Worthington City Code Section 110.02 is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

### 110.02 APPLICATION FOR LICENSE

All applications for licenses shall be made as follows:

- (A) All such applications shall be made at the office of the City Clerk upon forms furnished by the city, which forms must have been adopted by resolution of the Council.
- (B) All initial applications shall be accompanied by payment of \$25 to cover the cost of investigation as herein provided for.
- (C) All such applications must be subscribed, sworn to, and include, but not be limited to, the following:
  - (1) Applicant's name, age and citizenship.
  - (2) Applicant's present address and length of time he has lived at that address.
  - (3) Applicant's occupation and length of time so engaged.
  - (4) Applicant's addresses and occupations for the three years next preceding the date of application.
  - Names and addresses of applicant's employers, if any, for the three years next preceding the date of application.
  - (6) Type of license and location of premises for which application is made.
  - (7) At least four character references if applicant has not resided in the city for two years next preceding the date of application.
  - (8) Such other information as the Council shall deem necessary considering the nature of the business for which license application is made.
- (D) It is unlawful for any applicant to intentionally make a false statement or omission upon any application form. Any false statement in such application, or any willful omission to state any information called for on such application form, shall, upon discovery of such falsehood work an automatic refusal of license, or if already issued, shall render any license or permit issued pursuant thereto, void, and of no effect to protect the applicant from prosecution for violation of this title, or any part hereof.
- (E) The City Clerk shall, upon receipt of each application completed in accordance herewith, refer the application to the Worthington Police Department which shall

conduct a background investigation of the applicant(s) pursuant to Section (F) below. No application shall be approved before such investigation has been completed.

(F) In conducting the criminal history background investigation in order to screen license applicants, the Police Department is authorized to access data maintained in the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehensions Computerized Criminal History information system in accordance with BCA policy. Any data that is accessed and acquired shall be maintained at the Police Department under the care and custody of the chief law enforcement official or his or her designee. A summary of the results of the Computerized Criminal History data may be released by the Police Department to the licensing authority, including the City Council, the City Administrator/Clerk, or other city staff involved in the license approval process.

Before the investigation is undertaken, the applicant must authorize the Police Department by written consent to undertake the investigation. The written consent must fully comply with the provisions of Minn. Stat. Chap. 13 regarding the collection, maintenance and use of the information. Except for the positions set forth in Minnesota Statutes Section 364.09, the City will not reject an applicant for a license on the basis of the applicant's prior conviction unless conviction is for a felony, gross misdemeanor, or misdemeanor with a jail sentence. If the City rejects the applicant's request on this basis, the City shall notify the applicant in writing of the following:

- 1. The grounds and reasons for the denial.
- 2. The applicant complaint and grievance procedure set forth in Minnesota Statutes Section 364.06.
- 3. The earliest date the applicant may reapply for the license.
- 4. That all competent evidence of rehabilitation will be considered upon reapplication.
- (G) The background investigation pursuant to Section F shall be required on all applicants for the following licenses within the City:

All Licenses Under Chapter 111
Adult Oriented Business Licenses Under Chapter 112
Solicitor Registraion Under Chapter 113
Pawnbrokers Under Chapter 115
Public Dance Under Chapter 119

(H) When an applicant has on file an application in the form hereinbefore prescribed, subsequent applications for licenses may be made in such abbreviated form as the Council may adopt by resolution.

#### Section II.

Chapter 117 of the Worthington City Code is repealed in its entirety.

### **CASE ITEMS**

# 1. WORTHINGTON HRA RISING SUN ESTATES PROJECT UPDATE AND REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

In April, the HRA requested and received an \$800,000 secondary loan from the City Council to cover the financing gap for their \$3.768 million - 36 unit Rising Sun Estates project. The project was scheduled to commence in August but has been delayed to address several items, including construction costs/financing. Construction bids received by the HRA were collectively 13% higher than the original cost estimate/budget of \$3,327,218. The higher construction cost has raised the total development cost of Rising Sun Estates to \$4,245,000. This increase has lead to an additional gap that the HRA needs to address in order to proceed with the project.

At their September 9<sup>th</sup> meeting, the HRA Board discussed the financial status of the project. After much dialogue, the Board reaffirmed their belief in the market rate project and concluded they did not have the financial capability to cover the entire amount of the gap. They agreed to increase their equity to equal 10% of the total development cost. With the equity increase, the current financial picture of the project is outlined below.

Having fully explored the financial opportunities with the private sector and the lending institutions, the HRA Board has decided to approach Council about covering the remaining gap with an equity contribution or a low interest loan.

Randy Thompson, Worthington HRA Executive Director, and Lisa Graphenteen, Chief Operating Officer of the Housing Partnership, and are in attendance to provide a detailed project update and to formally request the additional financial assistance.
