man, he noticed the window of the garage was open and there was a bag lying on the ground. After further inspection, the officer found the bag contained beer, pop and cooked meat.


The man claimed to live at the residence, but later changed his story when pressed by the officer.

Scam Alert: The Paypal Scam

Have you ever tried to sell something online and had a potential buyer try to talk you into signing up for a Paypal account? Not just talk you into signing up for an account, but sounding like a Paypal commercial while doing so?

I recently had this happen when I was selling a couple items on Craigslist. The seller sent many emails trying to convince me of how safe Paypal is and why I should use it.

Fortunately, I immediately recognized this was a scam.

Recently many scammers have found a loophole in Paypal's "Buyer Protection Program" to con many people out of their property.

The scam works when someone buys an item from you and uses Paypal to pay for it. After the buyer receives the property, they will claim they did not receive the item and file a dispute with Paypal.

The loophole is that if you cannot prove the buyer actually received the item, Paypal will refund the money to the scammer and you will be out your property and the money.

It does not matter that you can prove you sent the item, it only matters if you can prove the buyer actually received it.

Paypal customer service is usually not much help in cases such as this. In addition, Paypal is not a bank and is not required to follow banking rules.

If you choose to use Paypal, make sure you know the terms and conditions of use. If someone tries to push you into using it, it could be a scam
