
Law Review: Peddlers, Solicitors and Transient Merchants

With the warm weather starting to head our way; peddlers, solicitors and transient merchants are following close behind.

Before a peddler or transient merchant conducts business, they need to fill out an application and receive a license from the city. A solicitor does not need a license, but they do need to be registered with the city.

Prohibited activities for a peddler, solicitor or transient merchant include failure to provide proof of license or registration and identification when requested or remaining on the property of another when requested to leave or to otherwise conduct business in a manner that a reasonable person would find obscene, threatening, intimidating or abusive.





Scam Alert: Computer Adware Scam

The latest scam to make the rounds in Worthington is the Computer Adware Scam.

This scam starts with a pop up message on your computer stating that your computer is infected with adware and directs you to call a number so tech support can have the adware removed.

In some cases, the "tech support" will ask for money first to remove the adware, where in other cases they will not.

In both cases, the person you called will remotely access your computer and place a virus on your computer.

This virus will typically include a keystroke logger that will record your passwords and bank account information.

If you find yourself a victim of this type of scam, unplug your computer from the internet and have a

trusted person or company remove the adware.

Ask an Officer: Traffic Crashes and Ambulances

I came across a traffic accident and I didn't know if I should call for an ambulance or not. When should I call for an ambulance?

While there is no blanket rule that would cover every scenario in which you should call for an ambulance, an ambulance should be called whenever you come across the following scenarios:

- 1.) Serious injury or death If someone was seriously injured or killed in a traffic crash.
- 2.) Mechanism of injury Next we look at the mechanism of injury. If the traffic crash involved high

speeds, rollover crashes, headon crashes, car vs pedestrian,
car vs bicycle, car vs
motorcycle, crashes where
someone was ejected, or
motorcycle crashes where the
rider was thrown from the
vehicle. This category
includes any type of crash
where someone can be injured
by the mechanism of the crash.

- 3.) Loss of consciousness Any crash where someone has lost consciousness, regardless of how brief the loss of consciousness is.
- 4.) Complaint of pain Any crash where someone has a complaint of pain from the crash.

5.) When in doubt – Anytime you are not sure if you should call an ambulance or not, call an ambulance. In medical emergencies, time is of the essence.
