Legalized Marijuana and Traffic Crashes

As we continue to look at how legalized marijuana has affected the people of Colorado, we will now look at traffic crashes.

Since recreational marijuana was legalized, Colorado has recorded a 45% increase in recreational marijuana users. For those aged 12 or older, marijuana use is the 3rd highest in the nation and is 85% higher than the national average.

Since recreational marijuana was legalized, traffic deaths involving drivers who tested positive for marijuana more than doubled from 55 in 2013 to 138 killed in 2017.


This is a 151% percent increase in marijuana related traffic deaths.

All traffic deaths in Colorado increased by 35% in in the same time frame.

This equates to one person killed every 2 ½ days in 2017 compared to one person killed every 6 ½ days.



These numbers came from the Colorado Department of Transportation and were verified by toxicology reports.



Ask an Officer: Is There a Knife Blade Length Law

Question: Does Minnesota have a law that restricts the blade length on knives?

Answer: Minnesota does not have a blade length law. In fact, Minnesota does not have many knife laws at all. Minnesota State Statute 609.66 does make it unlawful to manufacture, transfer, or possess a switch blade knife that opens automatically.

Minnesota State Statute 624.63 makes it unlawful for the proprietor, lessee, or occupant of any place of amusement, or any plat of ground, or building, who shall use or allow it to be used for the exhibition of skill in throwing any sharp instrument at or toward any human being... shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

The City of Worthington does not have a knife law ordinance; however, other cities and jurisdictions may have them.

Scam Alert: Tech Support Takedown 2019

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) just announced the largest ever nationwide elder fraud sweep focusing on tech support fraud.

Last year the FTC received almost 143,000 tech support scam complaints.

People 60 years and over were almost 5 times more likely to fall victim to this scam than younger people and were more likely to lose money on this scam. Due to the numerous complaints received by the FTC, they brought cases against many organizations, including Elite IT Partners, Inc.

In the Elite IT Partners case, the FTC alleges they purchased key words on Google that let them target people who lost their passwords and were seeking to recover them.

The unsuspecting victim would fill out a form and their telemarketers would call them and gain online access to their computers to "check for problems".

Once Elite IT Partners had access to the victim's computer, they would show

them fake evidence of viruses and other problems that had to be removed right away.

Then came the highpressure sales pitch that got many people to pay for unneeded repairs and maintenance programs.

If you need tech support, find a company you know and trust.

If you receive a phone call or pop up warning you of computer problems, just hang up!



If you think there is a problem with your computer, first update your security software and run a scan.

If you receive a call like this, call the FTC, they are listening.

New Law: Credit Freeze for Children

When someone steals a child's identity, it can be years before it is discovered and many more years after to correct the damage done.

According to Javelin Strategy and Research, in 2017 over 1 million children fell victim to identity theft and their losses totaled over \$2.6 billion.

Minnesota joined more then 30 other states in allowing families to freeze the credit reports for their minor children.

The credit freeze restricts access to credit reports and makes it challenging for a thief to open credit accounts under someone else's name. The new law allows someone acting on behalf of a person younger then 16 to place a freeze on their credit report.

When the credit reporting agency receives a credit freeze request, they must place the credit freeze on the account within 3 days of the request and send out a unique PIN to the customer within 10 days of the request.

The PIN is used to temporarily lift a credit freeze for short periods of time or for specific creditors, such as a car dealership to purchase a vehicle.

The law, which went into effect on September 21, 2018, also prohibits the credit reporting agencies from charging a fee to; place a credit freeze on their credit report, temporarily lift a credit freeze, or remove the freeze.

This law change applies to all Minnesotans and not just those under 16.
