### **National Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Week**

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy proclaimed May 15, 2023, as National Peace Officer Memorial Day and the calendar week in which May 15<sup>th</sup> falls into, as National Police Week.

Congress followed up by establishing a joint resolution that National Police Week pays special recognition to those law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others.

Across the United States, we lost 245 law enforcement officers with the top three causes of death being medical (113), gunfire (64), and vehicle crashes (57).

In Minnesota, we lost one officer last year, Deputy Sheriff Dallas



Edeburn due to a duty related heart attack.

At the time of this writing, Minnesota lost another hero to gunfire.

Pope County Deputy Sheriff, Josh Owen, was shot and killed at the scene of a domestic assault. A second Pope County Deputy Sheriff and a Starbuck Police Officer were also shot during the same incident.

This incident was less than a week after a police officer was shot in Granite Falls while they were serving a "knock and announce" search warrant during a drug investigation. Also two Wisconsin police officers were killed during a traffic stop in Cameron, Wisconsin.

As we prepare to remember and honor our fallen officers, please take a moment to keep these officers and their families in your thoughts and prayers.


### **End of Watch: Deputy Josh Owen**

End of Watch: Pope County Deputy Sheriff Josh Owen, April 15, 2023.

On April 15, 2023, at around 7:30 p.m., two deputies from Pope County Sheriff's Department and an officer from Starbuck Police Department responded to the town of Cyrus, Minnesota for a domestic dispute.

During the investigation of the incident, all three officers were shot. Deputy Owen was fatally wounded during the shooting.

Deputy Owen was a veteran of the United States Army and Minnesota National Guard. He also enjoyed spending time on the water and was an avid scuba diver.



Deputy Owen was killed on his 44<sup>th</sup> birthday.

He leaves behind his loving wife, Shannon and their young son.

Deputy Owen's name will be added to the National Law

Enforcement Memorial in Washington D.C. and will join the ranks of more than 23,000 other officers who have also given their lives in the line of duty.

### **Helmsley Charitable Trust Grant**

The Worthington Police Department has received a grant from the Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust Fund providing 14 brand new Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) worth almost \$30,000.

The Helmsley Charitable Trust gave \$18.8 million dollars to the University of Minnesota Medical School with the aim to provide law enforcement officers and first responders across Minnesota with more than 8,300 AEDs with the goal of improving cardiac arrest survival.

The three-year project aims to provide every law enforcement vehicle in Minnesota with an AED and to train agencies to deliver immediate cardiac care prior to the arrival of Emergency Medical Services.

Under the grant, the Police Department will receive the new AEDs in May and they will be deployed to all police department patrol vehicles. In addition to the new AEDs, the grant will cover the cost of any defibrillator patches used on a patient.

The Worthington Police Department is often the first on scene to medical emergencies and the new AEDs will help save lives!
