# Officer Profile: Chief Troy Appel

Born and raised in Worthington, Troy Appel grew up surrounded by the home construction business. He worked his way through high school and college as a carpenter, since his family built many of the homes in Worthington since the 1950's.

While attending college in 1993, Troy was hired to work part-time for the Worthington Police Department. After graduating from Mankato State in 1994, he continued to work for the department. Troy was hired as a full-time patrol officer in 1996, which was the same year he married his wife Kristin.

In 1999, Troy was promoted to investigations and worked as the only full-time drug investigator in Southwest Minnesota. He worked undercover to purchase large quantities of meth, cocaine, and marijuana for the local,



state, and federal agencies.

In 2005, Troy was appointed as the Commander of the newly formed Buffalo Ridge Drug Task Force and was asked to create a workable task force model to deter drug crime in the area. After nearly 10 years as BRDTF Commander, Troy was recently promoted to Public Safety Director

for Worthington, filling the position on October 6.

Troy has two daughters, Kalea and Kiara. In his time off, he enjoys spending time with his family, waterskiing, hunting, fishing, and biking.

## **Notable Calls**

Recently the Worthington Police Department received an attempt to locate message from the Coon Rapids Police Department to check on the welfare of a 23-year-old woman.

The Coon Rapids Police Department believed that the female was being held against her will.

The female was talking to a friend on her cell phone when she yelled "call the police" before her cell phone went dead.

To add to the cause for alarm, the suspect in this incident had an active Minnesota Department of Corrections arrest warrant and has a history of being assaultive toward law enforcement officers.

Officer Randy Liepold was working the morning of this incident and went to Interstate 90 to watch for the suspect's vehicle.

Shortly after beginning surveillance, Officer Liepold located the suspect vehicle and initiated a traffic stop.

As a result of the traffic stop, the suspect was taken into custody and the victim was treated for injuries received



in the incident and then reunited with her family.

As a result of Officer Liepold's actions, he received a letter of commendation for his level of professionalism that allowed this traumatic series of events to come to a safe and successful conclusion.

## **Law Review: Criminal Vehicular Homicide and Injury**

The law review for October is Minnesota State Statute 609.21 Criminal Vehicular Homicide and Injury. This statute makes it illegal for someone to cause the injury or death of another person:

- while operating a motor vehicle in a negligent manner
- while under the influence of drugs or alcohol
- where the driver who causes the accident leaves the scene
- where the driver has actual information that a peace officer has issued a citation or warning that the vehicle has been defectively maintained and that defect has created a present danger to others and the injury or death was caused by the defective maintenance.

## **Scam Alert: Another Facebook Scam**

The latest scam to hit Worthington uses Facebook to try to scam their victim.

The scam starts out when you receive a Facebook message from someone you know stating that they had some good news to share.

The good news is that they just happened to have won the lottery!

The scam can go one of two ways from here.

The friend on your Facebook messenger will ask you to send money via Western Union to pay for the taxes or they will tell you how you can also win the lottery by sending money via the Western Union for the taxes.



A couple things you can do to protect yourself are to review your Facebook privacy settings to allow only friends to see your posts. Also, talk to your friends in person if you receive a questionable message like these.

If your friend actually did send a message like this, talk them out of it and report the incident to the police department.
