Sergeant Gaul was born and raised in Worthington, graduating from the Worthington Senior High in 1984. He went on to attend Mankato State University, graduating in 1992 with a degree in Law Enforcement.

Chief Don Linssen hired Sergeant Gaul as a patrol officer on April 20, 1990.

Sergeant Gaul joined the Emergency Response Unit in 1992 and was promoted to unit leader in 1998.

In 1994, Sergeant Gaul became a Use of Force and Firearms instructor. In addition, he was selected as a Field Training Officer (FTO) and rose to running the FTO program by 2000.

On January 1, 2001, Chief Mike Cumiskey promoted Sergeant Gaul to Sergeant.

Sergeant Gaul oversees the following for the Worthington Police Department: FTO



Program, Firearms, Use of Force, scheduling and vacation requests, squad car ordering and maintenance, POST License maintenance, along with various other daily functions that keep the Worthington Police Department running smoothly.



New Telephone Number

The Worthington Police Department recently upgraded the telephone system to a VOIP system.

VOIP stands for Voice Over Internet Protocol and is a telephone system where the calls are routed over a broadband internet connection.

With the new telephone system, comes a new telephone number. The new Worthington Police Department telephone number is 507-295-5400.

Currently when you call the police department, your telephone call will automatically roll over to the new number. Within a couple months, if you call the police department's old telephone number, you will receive a message prompting you to call our new number. This change in telephone numbers will not affect the 911 system at all.

Besides a new telephone number, the only difference most people will notice is their caller ID will show "State of Minnesota" when someone from the police department calls you.

The first duty he has is as the Terminal Agency Coordinator (TAC).

As the TAC for the Worthington Police Department, Gary has the responsibility to ensure all Bureau of Criminal

Apprehension and Federal Bureau of Investigation policies are being followed in regard to accessing data bases operated by these agencies.

In addition, he is responsible for overseeing the criminal history record information, managing records, auditing and sanction process for users of these records.

The second part of Gary's job is IT or

information technology. Gary is in charge of ensuring all of the computer systems used by the police department are kept running. He is also assisting with the IT needs at the new Worthington Fire Station.

This includes mobile computers used in the patrol cars along with devises such as printers, ticket printers, evidence label printers, as well as driver's license scanners.
