School Safety Tips

It's hard to believe that summer is already over and that school is back in session, but here we are preparing for another school year.

In order to make the school year safe, let's look at a few safety tips.

Each year, one of the biggest complaints we receive is that people are not stopping for the school bus when the lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended.

Not only is this required by law, but it can have some serious consequences for those who do not stop.

If there are no children outside the bus when this happens, it becomes a misdemeanor with penalties of up to 90 days in jail and a \$1,000 fine.



If there are children outside the bus or if you pass the bus on the passenger side, the penalty is increased to a gross misdemeanor with penalties of up to 1 year in jail and a \$3,000 fine.

A driver who disobeys a school bus stop arm may be arrested for this violation.

This is on top of any civil liability that may come from striking the child and the guilt the driver would feel for the incident.

The school bus stop arm violation is not just a local issue. According to the National Coalition for Safer Road, in 2014 an estimated 13 million drivers illegally passed school buses while their stop arms were deployed. As shocking as that number is, it represents a 15% decrease in stop arm violations.

Please do your part to make this school year safe for our children!

Law Review: School Bus Flagger

Minnesota State Statute 169.444 has been amended to require obedience to a school bus flagger.

The statute states that a person may stop and hold vehicles on a street or highway with a posted speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less if the person is designated by the school districts transportation safety officer to act as a flagger.

Controlling traffic in order to enable one or more school buses to safely leave school property and enter the adjacent street or highway or to safely enter school property.

A person operating a motor vehicle that has been stopped by a school bus flagger may proceed after stopping only on instruction by the flagger or a peace officer.

As you are driving around this fall, please keep your eyes out for any school bus flaggers that may be in use.
